Originally chartered in 1937, APWA is the largest and oldest organization of its kind in the world, with Headquarters in Kansas City, Missouri, an office in Washington, D.C., and 67 Chapters throughout North America. APWA provides a forum in which public works professionals can exchange ideas, improve professional competency, increase the performance of their agencies and companies, and bring important public works-related topics to public attention in local, state, and federal arenas.

THE PROGRAM: The Southwest Florida Branch of the American Public Works Association Ben C. Pratt Scholarship Program is designed to assist those individuals who are pursuing a career in the public works field. Encompassing the disciplines from engineering, operations, maintenance, public administration and continuing education for career education of public agency employees is the goal of the program. This assistance in education promotes and ensures a continuation of the high level of skill, talent, and professionalism, which is the program's objective.

Traditionally for more than 100 years, the American Public Works Association, through its Chapters and Branches, has striven for the advancement and continued development of all of the various components, which make up the public works family. It is incumbent upon the membership of the local Branches to lend a helping hand to those who may choose the public services field as their career. The Scholarship Program is an intricate part of achieving this goal. The Southwest Florida Branch Scholarship Program contains three groups of individuals for which a scholarship may be awarded to any person whose principal residence is within the Branches' five county area (Lee, Charlotte, Collier, Hendry and Glades).

PUBLIC WORKS EMPLOYEES

Awarded to either a full or part-time employee of a public works agency who is continuing an academic program towards enhancing their personal and professional development for public works employment opportunities or advancement.

COLLEGE UNDERGRADUATE STUDENTS

Awarded to a college student who has earned at least 30 credit hours through enrollment at any accredited school in the United States, seeking a Bachelor of Science (BS) in Civil Engineering or any public works related field.

SENIOR HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS

Awarded to a senior high school student who will be the recipient of a diploma and has an SAT Score. Student should be pursuing an education in a public works related field.

AWARDED FUND GUIDELINES: Awarded funds shall be used for student fees including, but not limited to, tuition and books. The Southwest Florida Branch awarded scholarship funds may be used at accredited private colleges, state universities or junior colleges, community colleges, vo-techs and APWA academies. Following a review of all the scholarship applications, the finalists will be selected and notified. All selected finalists will receive telephone notice of award. The successful applicant will then be required to notify the Southwest Florida Branch Scholarship Chairman within 30 days as to which institute the check is to be paid. Failure to do so by the successful applicant will nullify his or her award.

APPLICATION PROCEDURE: The Southwest Florida Branch will inform each applicant as to the status of his or her application on or before the award deadline. The procedure for applicants who desire to apply for a scholarship is as follows:

A. Obtain an application in any of the following ways:

1. Contact an officer of the American Public Works Association Southwest Florida Branch and request an application.
2. Contact the Southwest Florida Branch Scholarship Committee Chairman and request an application.
3. Contact the appropriate guidance counselor at your high school or university and request an application.
4. Contact your Human Resources Director and request an application.

Awarded to a senior high school student who will be the recipient of a diploma and has an SAT Score.
